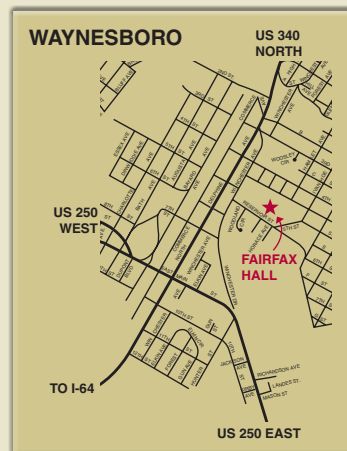

Directions

From Charlottesville and points East:

Take Interstate 64 West to exit 96. At the end of the ramp, make a right turn onto Delphine Avenue.

OR

From Harrisonburg and points West:

Take Interstate 81 South to Interstate 64 East. Take exit 96. At the end of the ramp, take a left onto Delphine Avenue.

THEN

Proceed North on Delphine Avenue. You will come to the intersection of Main Street (US 250) and Delphine Avenue. Proceed through the stoplight. Go under railroad underpass and take the second right onto 5th Street. At stop sign, turn right onto N. Winchester Avenue. Take the first left onto Reservoir Street. Fairfax Hall will be on your left.

History

The Hotel Brandon was built in 1890 in the Queen Anne style as the premier railroad hotel in Basic City, Virginia. It offered lodging to 200 and was the site of many a grand event.

In 1913, the hotel was converted into the Brandon Institute, a small coeducational art and music school. In 1920, its name and use changed again to Fairfax Hall, a finishing school for grades 9–12. These were the “Glory Days” for private schools and Fairfax Hall was attended by young women from all over the world.

After 55 years, Fairfax Hall closed its doors and in 1975 the Commonwealth of Virginia’s Department of Corrections leased the building as an academy for staff development.

The building was restored in 2000–2001 into 54 apartments and the reception facility. Once again, it hosts some of the finest weddings and events in the Valley.
